"Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all"


Under Article 28 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), Pakistan has pledged to,

"...recognize the right of the child to education,...and on the basis of equal opportunity...

Literacy Rates


Only 62.8% of the population of Pakistan (10 years and above) is literate








Million children are OOS, which is the second highest number globally²



Almost **12 million** girls are OOS while only 13% reach 9th grade³








